Speha Fresia: Insights from the REWIND Platform Pilots

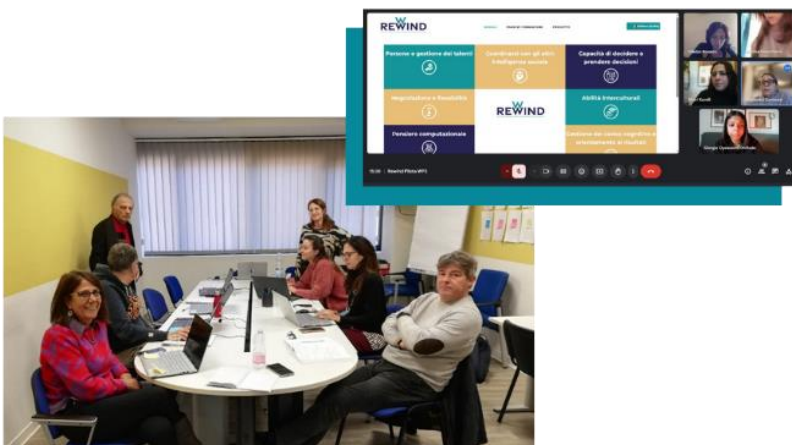
The REWIND Multilingual eLearning Platform has received glowing feedback, praised for its **flexibility in self-directed learning** and classroom use. A key takeaway was the need for a concise synopsis of the platform's Open Educational Resources (OERs) and a clear "Call to Action" for their practical applications.

Multilingualism has been pivotal, enabling participation from third-country nationals by incorporating **Spanish, French, and English**—key languages for migrants in Europe.

Pilot sessions were held in November in person in Rome and online in December 2024.

Participants, including trainers, teachers, and women social entrepreneurs, provided actionable insights that are shaping the final platform updates.

The REWIND platform continues to break barriers and promote accessible, inclusive learning.



IDEC Webinar Highlights: Social Enterprise Success Strategies

IDEC hosted a pivotal webinar on December 17, 2024, piloting their new eLearning platform with a focus on **"Negotiation and Flexibility" in social enterprises**. The event brought together local working groups, VET trainers, and industry stakeholders.

In November 2024, interviews took place with leading social enterprises and business consultants, including valuable insights from Mr. Konstantinos Papadakis, co-founder of AgroID Social Cooperative. They enabled IDEC to identify key strategies for cooperative success, including adapting business models for sustainability, building collaborative networks, and leveraging social innovation through circular economy practices

The findings emphasize how social economy models, supported by EU initiatives, can foster sustainable business growth while strengthening local communities.

Just a few spoonsful away from the Cité de Carcassonne, an ice cream factory faced closure—a disaster for the workers and their craft. Refusing to accept defeat, they united with a vision:

"Let's create our own work—a company that reflects who we are"

Their determination gave birth to La Fabrique du Sud, known today as La Belle Aude, a remarkable worker cooperative that transforms local ingredients into high-quality ice cream.

Sc'Opara had the opportunity to interview **La Belle Aude**. They shared insights into their democratic governance model, focus on local economic impact, and commitment to sustainability. By empowering their members through training and active participation in decision-making, and prioritizing regional production and energy efficiency, La Belle Aude demonstrates a successful and inspiring example of collective ownership and sustainable entrepreneurship.
